NHS Property Services Ltd, on behalf of NHS England, notes that the Plan refers to "NHS and the Clinical *Commissioning Group*" as key infrastructure providers with whom the Council maintains regular contact, in accordance with the Duty to Co-operate.

Following changes to the structure of the NHS, as set out in the Health and Social Care Act 2012, the various responsibilities previously held by the Primary Care Trust have been redistributed between several new bodies.

The role of NHS England is to commission all healthcare services, incorporating the provision of primary care facilities within its administrative area, including within Maldon District. The Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) is responsible for commissioning other healthcare services including elective hospital care, rehabilitation care, urgent & emergency care, most community health services, mental health and learning disability services.

NHS Property Services Ltd is responsible for advising NHSE and local CCGs on all NHS estate related matters.

In light of these varying NHS roles and responsibilities, it is requested that paragraph 8.5 is amended to refer to the relevant bodies to be consulted by the Council under the Duty to Co-operate.


