SEWERAGE & SURFACE WATER NORTH FAMBRIDGE

At the present time there is no spare capacity within Anglian Waters system to take further development in North Fambridge

A joint statement from Anglian Water, Environment Agency and Essex County Council shows that there are surface and foul water problems in the village.

North Fambridge regularly suffers from flooding due to this problem, which blights many residents lives even though this has been raised continually over the years by the residents and Parish Council.

No future development in North Fambridge should take place until this is resolved.
