



VEHICLE PARKING STANDARDS
SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING DOCUMENT (SPD)
ADOPTION STATEMENT

Maldon District Council adopted the Vehicle Parking Standards Supplementary Planning Document on the 8th November 2018.

This Adoption Statement has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of Regulations 11 and 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012.

The Vehicle Parking Standards SPD provides additional detailed guidance to landowners, developers, Registered Providers and the community on the Council's approach to vehicle parking provision within new development. This document supplements policies, T2 Accessibility, D1 Design & Built Environment, H4 Effective Use of Land and I1 Infrastructure & Services in the approved Maldon District Local Development Plan (2017). The Council will use this SPD in the future determination of planning applications.

This SPD replaces the 2006 Vehicle Parking Standards SPD.

A number of modifications were made to the SPD following consultation. These are set out in full in the Consultation Statement.

Legal challenge

Any person with sufficient interest in the decision to adopt the Supplementary Planning Document may make an application to the High Court for permission to apply for judicial review of the decision. Any such application must be made promptly, in any event, no later than three months after the date on which the SPD was adopted (8 November 2018).
