Dear Sirs

Please confirm what actions you are taking to safeguard the wellbeing of the residents in Burnham on Crouch and adjoining districts. You may or may not be aware that the doctors surgery in Burnham is under review and if improvements are not made then there is a serious threat that the surgery will be closed.

Whilst accepting that additional housing is needed and is being forced through by the Government where will the residents be able to consult a doctor?

The local hospital (Broomfield) is also under pressure and if the doctors surgery closes, the A & E department of Broomfield will be overwhelmed, along with the ambulance service that is finding it difficult to respond within the required time.

Notwithstanding the above, will there be sufficient schools in the area to cope with the influx of additional families? Can the gas, water, sewage, electricity and phone systems cope with the additional usage? When are the roads going to be upgraded to cope with the additional traffic, bearing in mind that the roads are not suitable for the type and quantity of vehicles using them at present.

Your plan as usual does not quantify what is being done to address the issues mentioned above. Vague generalisations are used without concrete proposals put in place for surgeries, hospital / clinic, schools roads and the utility services.
