Dear David Coleman

I am writing to express my objection to the housing development proposed for Holloway Road, Heybridge, Maldon.

I have been a resident of Holloway Road for the past 26 years, during which time we have experienced repeated flooding; the last time being Christmas day 2012. It is unthinkable that an additional 1000 homes are planned on the land behind our houses, which will only exacerbate the situation. I appreciate that promises have been made to resolve this, but I am extremely sceptical that this will be carried out and all past promises remain unfulfilled.

In addition to this issue, the transport and road infrastructure is not capable of supporting the additional volume of traffic. All routes to and from Heybridge are congested during the morning and evening peak commuting times; with long delays on roads leading to the A12 through Hatfield Pevrel and Danbury.

Thirdly there is the issue of schooling; there is currently limited choice for primary schooling and only one secondary school located in Maldon. The addition of 1000 homes could easily result in an additional 1,500 – 2,000 places being required. This is neither practical nor desirable for the Plume school.

The plan is ill conceived and of a totally inappropriate scale for the area and should be refused planning permission.
